Course Objectives:

To help participants to understand the concepts of community cohesion, integration and poly-culturalism.

To think historically about community cohesion in the UK.

To identify factors that encourage and factors that discourage community cohesion.

To think about what different perspectives on community cohesion and integration might be.

To examine some of the available frameworks for planning and monitoring cohesion based initiatives.

To look at a variety of different initiatives that encourage community cohesion.
